In 1900, about 40% of Americans lived in rural areas. By 2010, that number dropped to 17%. In just over a century, massive economic and social changes moved millions of Americans into urban areas. Still, nearly 60 million Americans live in rural areas today. To complete the perspective, only 3.5% of the U.S. landmass is considered urban. Therefore, the vast majority of the landscape remains rural.

Crossroads: Change in Rural America, on exhibit at VBDL Webster Memorial in Decatur, October 18 - December 5, offers the region a chance to look at our own paths.

Crossroads is designed to prompt discussions about what happened when America's rural population became a minority of the country's population and the ripple effects that occurred.

The exhibition is part of **Museum on Main Street**, a unique collaboration between **Smithsonian Institution Exhibiting Service (SITES)**, **Michigan Humanities**, and **Van Buren District Library**.

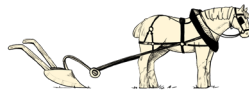
