2016 EMPLOYEE AWARDS

Three staff members were recognized for their achievements in 2016.

The 2016 Employee of the Year is Jeffrey Babbitt, Library Clerk and Marketing Associate at the Antwerp Sunshine Branch, Mattawan. The honor is annually given to the staff member who demonstrates consistent hard work and achievement, provides an outstanding level of service beneficial to the library and patrons, exhibits energy and passion for the job, and whose actions have made a positive difference.

Babbitt employed his talents and motivation during the past year to organize a teen writer's group and challenge, a musician's group, actively participated on the organizing committee for the area's first GeekFest, and he was selected as a top five finalist in the SOUP competition at the Michigan Library Association Conference. Besides working for VBDL, Babbitt is enrolled in the Library and Information Science program at Wayne State University.

Recipients of the 2016 Customer Service Award and Genius Idea Award were Mollie Barkovich and Bobbi Martindale, respectively. According to Library Director Ryan Wieber, Barkovich, Branch Manager at Webster Memorial Library, Decatur, was instrumental in expanding the library's outreach and programs, and she demonstrated infectious enthusiasm among staff and patrons.

Martindale, Bangor Branch Librarian, was recognized for her start to finish involvement with the Children's Story Walk event in Bangor. A story walk is an innovative, fun way to experience nature, exercise and storybooks through the placement of laminated, colorful pages along a trail in a local park.

Each recipient received a certificate of appreciation and monetary gift from the Friends of the Van Buren District Library.

From the Director

A little library history: Organized in 1934, the Van Buren County Library System had its beginnings in a room at the county courthouse. Covert Township added its local library to the county system in 1945, followed by Bloomingdale, Bangor and Gobles in 1946, Lawrence in 1947, and Antwerp in 1957. Decatur and Lawrence share the distinction of having the earliest local libraries (1870s), while Gobles and Bloomingdale were 1934 Depression-era WPA initiatives.

Oftentimes, early township libraries consisted of a collection of a few hundred books in a downtown storeroom or office, contributed by way of donations or local fees and appropriations. Today's Van Buren District Library system, consisting of seven busy branches scattered around the county, has its roots based on a network of small local libraries begun by like-minded folks who recognized the importance of literacy and the value of a library in their town.

Libraries of course have changed dramatically since the 1930s and our Van Buren patrons today expect facilities, collections, services and programs that reflect modern trends found in a more digital world. Printed books and a love of reading still form the foundation of the library; however, we must also continue adapting to the growing demand for digital books, audios, movies and music. VB-DL's circulation numbers in 2016 continued to mimic nationwide trends of fewer printed books being checked out and an increase in materials being downloaded or streamed. Our libraries continued to be key providers of high speed Internet access through public workstations and Wi-Fi, and sometimes the only solution for families who have no access at home. The library's Wi-Fi usage increased significantly last year as more patrons conveniently sought out the Internet on their own devices.

As a result of a new operational millage passed in November 2015, VBDL was able to provide enhanced open hours and newer collections. All branches now offer six-day service with more consistent hours and a significant increase in the availability of popular new titles. This is an added convenience for patrons who appreciate both the large selection of available titles and shorter waiting periods for brand new titles or authors. More new titles are



now available with the introduction of "Hot Picks," a collection of new titles that cannot be reserved, have a shorter checkout period, and are available on a first come-first served basis. Another new offering in 2016—"Hoopla"—features a huge selection of streaming movies, audios, music, and books that helps those patrons who prefer to supplement their library usage by way of tablet, phone or computer. Digital checkouts or downloads increased 68% in 2016 compared to the previous year.

In early 2016, the Library Board and several library staff members reviewed and revised the 2014 Strategic Plan. The most significant change was the addition of a new goal to "Provide a Foundation for Reading Success from Birth to Adulthood." Objectives for this goal include establishing the library as a recognized literacy resource and to constantly encourage a love for reading. As a result, all branches offer consistently scheduled and early literacy-based story times, makerspace (STEM-based) activities for elementary-age kids, and monthly adult book-discussion groups. We're especially striving to find ways to introduce the library to non-users and get books into children's hands. After-school programs, "1,000 Books before Kindergarten," and the Great Start-sponsored "Birthday Book Club" are all initiatives designed to do just that!

It is important that EVERY branch of the Van Buren District Library remain VITAL pieces to their respective communities and continue to be interesting, exciting and useful places. VBDL staff and board are ensuring this happens by adapting to new technology, planning for unique and beneficial library spaces, offering new collections and innovative services, and promoting a love for reading!




"VBDL adds to the quality of my life," Thiede says. "I'm able to enjoy activities that I might not otherwise participate in if not offered at the library."


