Library Director Ryan Wieber announced in December that Carol Nelson (above left) and Denise Campagna were the recipients of the 2015 Librarian of the Year Award due to their dedication, enthusiasm and passion for their work, the library, and ultimately, the patrons.

Nelson, who started as a Bangor Branch clerk in 2004, was credited with the ability to please patrons and fellow co-workers by exhibiting a consistently gracious and caring attitude. "Carol takes pride in serving others," Wieber says. "She makes everyone who walks through the door feel welcome and important. She is dedicated, dependable and an excellent representative of the library's mission."

Campagna, having earned her second Librarian of the Year Award, was recognized for instilling in the Lawrence community her enthusiasm and passion for library programs and services. "Denise's passion for the library shines through every day," Wieber says. "I know I can always count on her to make the right decisions, energetically promote the library and provide a healthy, fun and rewarding staff environment."

Wieber credited Campagna with making the Lawrence Branch a true community center by offering programs such as the Reader's Café, Graphic Novel Club, Tai Chi, high school art exhibits, photography contests, author visits and more.

Each recipient received a certificate of appreciation and monetary gift from the Friends of the Van Buren District Library.

From the Director

"Great things are happening at the Van Buren District Library." This unofficial slogan is reflective of the work being undertaken to create a more dynamic library that meets the needs of our communities in the areas of new programs and services, expanded children's activities and an increase of digital offerings.

According to the Pew Center for Research recent study Libraries at the Crossroads, a majority of Americans recognize their local libraries as places that should support local education, embrace new technologies, and provide spaces for reading, studying, working and programming. VBDL made improvements in each of those areas in 2015 by significantly increasing technology training opportunities, offering more arts and cultural programs, teaming up better with local schools, and by analyzing our circulation trends and collection configurations in order to make adjustments to space usage.

Van Buren District Library is supported at each location by a caring and generous force of volunteers and Friends of the Library members. Last year's book sales, summer reading program activities, and word-of-mouth promotions were successful because of the special dedication and attention given by our volunteers.

VBDL's statistics from 2015 reflect a nationwide downward trend in circulation of printed books, an increase in digital checkouts, and an upward surge in the library as a WiFi hotspot. New materials acquisitions took a hit as revenue decreased, however a push was still made to provide more copies of popular items. Our website experienced a major makeover in terms of design and content, and the library's overall marketing plan became more active in 2015 with added staff hours and attention to consistency in promoting library news and activities.

Financially, the library had the good fortune of the district's voters approving an additional .20 millage for ten years, allowing VBDL to recoup some of the significant hit from a power plant tax tribunal judgment. The new revenue will aid us in restoring the materials budgets back to appropriate levels, and it will also enhance services to branches in Bangor, Bloomingdale, Covert, Gobles and Lawrence by adding a sixth day of service in mid-2016. Property tax values are on the upward swing; however, VBDL's funding is also dependent on State Aid and Penal Fines, which vary from year to year. The recent legislative reduction to personal property taxes will also affect our revenue beginning in 2017. The library board continually has to balance a need to improve the library versus the reality of running a tight budget and cautiously planning against future funding threats.

Great things did indeed happen at the library in 2015, and there is much yet to come in the near future with more convenient open hours, more popular book and audio-visual additions, and a growing number of requested programming ideas. Please see the highlights from 2015 on the following pages.




