## FROM THE DIRECTOR



Throughout my career, I've noticed a great many people who are attracted to public libraries are what I refer to as "sanctuary seekers." These are people who are looking for a place that makes them feel welcome, safe, and undisturbed. Public libraries have traditionally been viewed as quiet places, and often they can be, but

anyone who has ever attended a preschool story time or summer reading event for older children will tell you that's frequently not the case. Be that as it may, the perception of public libraries as a quiet place often attracts people who are searching for refuge from any number of things: the business of their daily lives, a chaotic home, or perhaps problems they would prefer to forget, if only for a little while. Many people who work in public libraries are attracted to this type of work for the very same reasons; they're looking for an occupation that is calm and perhaps less demanding. Indeed, many people do find peace and serenity at the library.

However, once many arrive at the public library, they discover something very different. They discover connection. This has been my experience of public libraries. I first chose public library work because I was looking for an alternative to jobs I found unattractive. Like many "library people", by nature I'm an introvert and I was hoping to make some extra money in high school by doing something other than working in fast food or a supermarket. I was looking for something that wasn't primarily social. What I found was something completely unexpected. When people think of the public library, they often forget the word "public." Public libraries are places that welcome everyone, regardless of their socio-economic status, race, gender, or sexuality. As long as individuals are willing to abide by the library's policies, they are welcome. Working at my local public library, I encountered people of every background and type, and this caused a previously unknown piece of myself to come alive. I may have initially chosen public library work because I was attempting to avoid others, but I chose to stay in public library work for exactly the opposite reason, to connect with others.

Public libraries have embraced the role of fostering connection among the communities they serve. For example, all seven branches of the Van Buren District Library sponsor numerous offerings to connect their communities to the world around them, and to each other: Transparent Language learning platform, Princeton Online Tutoring from Tutor.com, Ancestry.com, 24-hour outdoor Wi-Fi Internet access, Michigan Legal Help, mobile Internet hotspots for loan, and many dozens of events, classes, and programs. However, over the years I've noticed one VBDL location stands out in terms of connecting the community it serves, and that is VBDL's Lawrence Branch Library.

VBDL's Lawrence Branch is truly the hub of its community. Lawrence's manager, Anne Cox. seemingly knows absolutely everyone in town, and everyone in town seemingly knows her. In any given month Lawrence Branch Library sponsors dozens of events, classes, and programs. In January 2024 alone the Lawrence Branch sponsored 37. While there's no yoga studio in Lawrence, the Lawrence Branch Library doubles as one, with twice-weekly classes. The Lawrence Branch Library sponsors an annual concert which routinely draws over 300 people. The Lawrence Branch Library also collaborates with the Village and Township of Lawrence for events such as the annual Ox Roast and holiday festivities. Of course, if one wants a quiet place to spend some quality time alone with a book, one may do that in one of the Lawrence Branch's comfy chairs. However once one enters the Lawrence Branch Library, they may find themselves chatting with a neighbor they haven't seen in a while, using its Wi-Fi or public access computers to connect with friends or to look for a job, or drawn into one of the Lawrence Branch's many events.

The paradox of public libraries is they are often viewed as places of quiet solitude, when in reality they are gateways to a larger world. That portal may be through the learning or empathy which comes from reading a book, or it may be from connecting with others in a much more tangible way, such as participating in a class or learning a foreign language using the library's Transparent Language platform. If you want to spend some quality alone time, Van Buren District Library has you covered. However, if you would like to connect with your community, or even the larger world, Van Buren District Library can show you the way.

## VBDL & ITS COMMUNITY PARTNERS

The Van Buren District Library is all about connection, from linking patrons with books and resources to creating opportunities for coming together through library events. Libraries play a crucial role in creating vibrant communities by establishing these relationships, as well as developing partnerships with local businesses and organizations. In 2023, Van Buren District Library continued to create connections with local organizations to better serve the residents of Van Buren County.

One of VBDL's goals has been increasing access to the internet and technology, and to achieve this goal, the strengthened its partnerships with library has Bloomingdale Communications and Midwest Energy and Communications. Van Buren District Library initially partnered with Bloomingdale Communications in 2018, with Bloomingdale Communications donating \$3,000 toward the Library District's purchase of Princeton Online Tutoring, also known as Tutor.com. Tutor.com is an innovative platform allowing students and adults access to credentialed tutors with expertise in dozens of academic topics. Tutor.com also offers test preparation resources, in addition to live job search assistance and résumé writing help.

During the early stages of the COVID-19 pandemic, Bloomingdale Communications aided the Library District with outfitting its branches with outdoor broadband WiFi access points, loaning the Library District the necessary equipment for installation. The addition of the WiFi access points would allow patrons 24/7 access to this necessary utility from the comfort of their vehicles. After the WiFi access points were installed, public use of the Library District's broadband Internet connection more than tripled.

The Van Buren District Library conducted beginner computer classes using laptops generously donated by Bloomingdale Communications in October 2023. These laptops facilitated programs at the Webster Memorial Branch and the Lawrence Branch, focusing on basic computer skills and introducing Canva, an online graphic design tool. These classes aim to equip Van Buren County residents, especially the 13% without internet access at home, with modern technological skills. Bloomingdale Additionally, Communications supplied a tablet for library public relations and marketing purposes, enabling the library to connect and engage with the community on social media.



In addition, VBDL forged connections with the Van Buren County Courts. On December 1, 2023, VBDL and several other libraries in Van Buren County became designated Michigan Legal Self-Help site navigators. As navigators, all VBDL branches have received training to help show patrons how to use the resources and information available on the Michigan Legal Self-Help website.

Other organizations that the Van Buren District connects with include Help Me Grow Van Buren, making it easier for families with young children to find resources and materials to ensure their children grow to be healthy and ready to succeed in school. The library also created a relationship with the Van Buren Cass Health Department to participate in special story times to instill healthy habits in children and their families. In September 2023, the library partnered with The Great Start Collaborative, Bronson Hospital in South Haven, Van Buren Community Mental Health, and the Family Coalition (Great Start Collaborative) to create a transportable Story Stroll that was installed outside the Lawrence Branch to encourage reading in the great outdoors and is available for use in the county.

As an integral part of the Van Buren County community, VBDL takes pride in its partnerships with local businesses and organizations, and the ones mentioned here give only glimpses of the connections libraries make in their communities. By developing these partnerships with organizations and businesses that serve and create jobs in Van Buren County, we work together to benefit the whole county and its communities. Looking back at 2023, VBDL has worked hard to bring the community together, and the library is excited to continue creating these connections in the future.


