From the Director

In 2025, the Van Buren District Library is celebrating its 35th anniversary. In actuality though, the Van Buren County system of libraries from which our current District Library originated is much older.

The Van Buren County Library was founded in 1934 and was originally located in the basement of the Van Buren County Court House in Paw Paw. The first branch to join was Covert in 1945. Bangor, Bloomingdale, and Gobles followed in 1946. Lawrence Library joined in 1947; then Antwerp Sunshine Library in 1957.

In 1959, the Decatur Township Library signed a joint operating agreement with the Van Buren County Library, and the two relocated to the newly constructed Webster Memorial Library in Decatur in 1960. For the next 30 years the Van Buren County Library and Decatur Township Library worked in tandem, with the County Library system using Webster Memorial Library as its administrative headquarters, with the chief executive of the County Library system also serving as the director of the Decatur Township Library. Funding for the joint venture was provided by both Van Buren County and the Webster Memorial Trust.

However, by the late 1980s it became apparent that this model was no longer sustainable. When times were good, the library system got by, but when the economy experienced a downturn, library funding from the County was sharply reduced.

To solve the problem, then Van Buren County Library Executive Director David Tate and library attorney Richard Butler had an idea – Rather than relying on an annual appropriation from Van Buren County, what if the library system could fund itself in a manner similar to a school district, by levying its own property tax millage? In order to accomplish this, legislation allowing for the formation of public library districts would need to be passed at the state level. With the blessing of the Van Buren County Board of Commissioners, Tate and Butler drafted the legislation and enlisted the aid of State Senator Harmon Cropsey from Decatur, who sponsored the bill. The District Library Establishment Act, Public Act 24 of 1989, was signed into law by Governor James Blanchard on May 22, 1989.

While Decatur Township Library and Van Buren County Library had been operating together from Webster Memorial Library in Decatur, both were still legally separate organizations with their own governing boards. On January 1, 1990, Van Buren County Library and Decatur Township Library became the first public libraries in Michigan to re-establish under the District Library Establishment Act,

dissolving their individual boards and merging into one. Subsequently, a millage was passed throughout Van Buren District Library's service area to support the newly reorganized institution.

Since Van Buren County Library and Decatur Township Library led the charge to pass the District Library Establishment Act in 1989, approximately 150 of Michigan's roughly 400 public libraries have taken advantage of this law to re-establish as district libraries, including much larger public library systems such as Kalamazoo Public Library, Kent District Library in suburban Grand Rapids, and Capital Area District Library in the greater Lansing area, to name just a few.

To me, as a public library professional, the conception and passage of the District Library Establishment Act was the most significant achievement of Van Buren County Library and Decatur Township Library, now known as Van Buren District Library. Very few, if any, public libraries in the State of Michigan may boast of an accomplishment which has benefitted so many of their peers, and by extension, so many library users across the state. Having said that, few are aware of the Van Buren District Library's contribution to Michigan public library funding and governance. In honor of 35 years of the Van Buren District Library, I may think of no better way of celebrating than to share the inestimable impact that our public library system has had in the State of Michigan.

The VB County Library was located in the Paw Paw Courthouse. 1945 Covert Library (founded in 1923) joins the VB County Library. 1946 Bangor Library (founded in 1909) joins the VB County Library. Bloomingdale Library (founded in 1935) joins the VB County Library. Gobles Library (founded circa 1930) joins the VB County Library. 1947 Lawrence Library (founded in 1878) joins the VB County Library. 1957 Antwerp Sunshine Library (founded in 1911) joins the VB County Library. 1959 Decatur Twp Library (founded circa 1870) signs a joint operating agreement with the VB County Library. They remain legally separate organizations with their own governing boards, but agree to share resources and a single Executive Director. 1960 The Decatur Twp Library and the VB County Library begin operating together from the newly completed Webster Memorial Library building in the Village of Decatur. 1990 The VB County Library and the Decatur Twp Library are the first libraries in Michigan to reorganize under Public Act 24 of 1989 "The District Library

Establishment Act" merging to become the Van Buren District Library.

The cold didn't stop us from kicking things off in January with science experiments in the snow and hot cocoa served outdoors. As the weather warmed, we expanded our activities, enjoying sidewalk chalk art, Nerf battles on the library lawn, and even blending smoothies on a kid-powered smoothie bike! Across all branches, we hosted nearly 100 outdoor programs, giving our community countless opportunities to explore and enjoy the great outdoors.

 Just seeing the excitement patrons have when they see that we have an item they have been looking for.

What keeps you passionate about working in the library?

• The relationships I've built with our patrons and with the kids who visit me here at the library or who I see when I take the library on the road. [...]The passion to want to do right by those patrons and the ones I haven't met yet keeps me going.



What are some of your favorite or funniest patron memories?

• There have been so many patrons over the years that imprinted themselves in my mind. Sharon, when asked, "How are you today, Sharon?" would respond without fail, "Still fat, still sassy," and then laugh and laugh. The little girl who came with her class for a library visit in the morning and then saw me at the store later that evening and was so disappointed that "They let you go home!" Erika, who was new to town and spoke very little English but came to our preschool programs with her 3 yr old every week, showed up very pregnant and very much in labor one day but our group of moms took care of her and watched over her little one so she could safely get herself to the hospital. She brought the new baby the following week.

What do you hope to see in the future for VBDL?

 Near future: Continued growth in offerings to the public but still maintaining what the library is at its core -- a place of books and knowledge and learning, programs and activities and social gathering places. Far off future: Continued place to gather with warm and welcoming human interactions, welcoming staff and abundant offerings for everyone.

 The Branch Manager [at the Gobles branch] role has not changed much; however, due to some staffing changes several years ago I took on a role in Collection Development, selecting and ordering Adult Non-fiction titles for all seven VBDL locations.
